LETTER FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Eureka Residents,

Warm greetings to each of you!

As election season approaches, so too does the end of my time serving as your mayor. By December, I will have had the honor of holding this role for approximately 13 months, a time filled with meaningful progress, rewarding challenges, and heartfelt memories.

Serving this city has been one of the greatest privileges of my life. I am incredibly proud of the work we have accomplished together, and I want to take a moment to recognize the dedication and integrity of your city council. Through thoughtful collaboration and a commitment to Eureka's future, we have made many important, and at times difficult decisions in the best interest of our community.

Reflecting on my time in office, I am proud to share just a few of the many achievements we have made as a city:

- We now have a prosecuting attorney actively supporting our municipal efforts.
- We have partnered with an engineering firm to address key infrastructure projects, including roads and city systems.
- A code enforcement officer was hired, complete with a city vehicle to support their work.
- Our Planning and Zoning Commission has been reestablished and is fully operational.
- We welcomed a new building inspector to ensure our growth aligns with standards and safety.
- Several new and revised ordinances have been passed, covering Code Enforcement, Nuisance Control, Parking, Cemeteries, Short-Term Rentals, and Mobile Homes.
- A modernized system for codifying and accessing city ordinances has been implemented, enhancing transparency and efficiency for both staff and residents.

We have also reinvigorated community traditions and services:

- The annual Christmas Tree Lighting Parade and Ceremony returned which is a joyful and unifying celebration for all.
- The Book Mobile, which once passed us by, now stops in our town. It is a wonderful sight to see students and residents embracing reading and lifelong learning.
- Our historic Memorial Building received much-needed upgrades, including a new furnace, water heater, and electrical improvements.

In terms of infrastructure, we have tackled major water leaks, completed repairs on multiple fire hydrants, and continue to address ongoing needs to ensure public safety.

And this is just the beginning. The path ahead includes security camera installations, park improvements, and other exciting initiatives already in the works.

Of course, none of this would be possible without the incredible individuals who volunteer their time and talents. Your contributions are the backbone of this community, and I thank each and every one of you.

Although my term is nearing its end, I assure you, I am not slowing down. I will continue to serve with energy and commitment through my final day in office. Thank you for your support.
